## How is SIP working to make its student pool more diverse?

SIP works with partner institutions to recruit qualified and motivated underserved students who may not otherwise have applied to the program.

SIP staff meet with administrators and counselors at partner institutions to explain the program's research offerings, need-based scholarships, and other details.

SIP staff make presentations to students and work with partner institution staff to support students through the application process.

During the summer when the program is in session, SIP staff work with partner institution staff to identify and overcome challenges that the students may face.

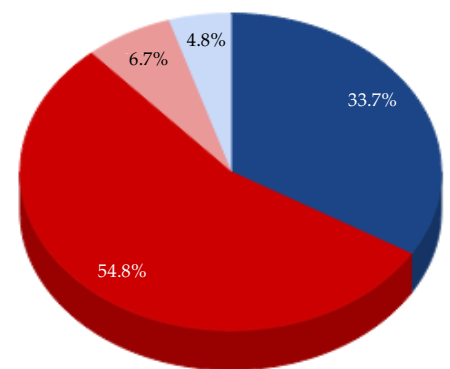
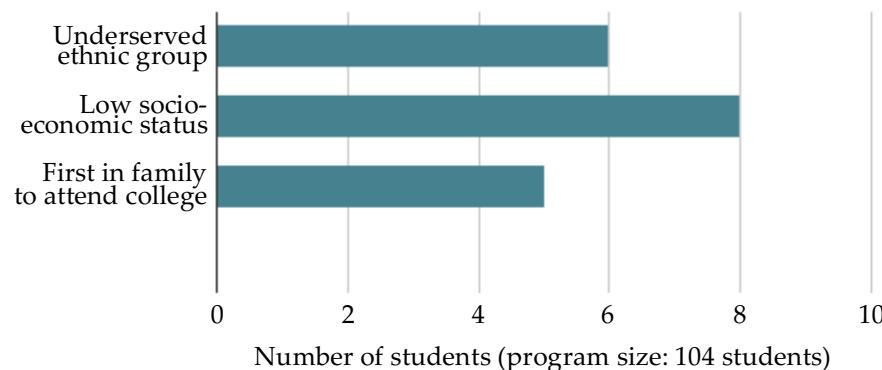
## Finances

In 2015, SIP offered 9 full and 5 partial scholarships on the basis of financial need. SIP would like to increase the number to 15 full and 10 partial scholarships in the summer of 2016.

On average, a scholarship for the 10-week SIP program costs \$5,000. This includes the academic program fee, weekday housing and meals on campus, and some transportation costs.

Scholarships funds have come from donations to SIP made by corporations and individuals who value the importance of real research opportunities for *all* high school students.
